To ensure that high standards of response are maintained in the event of an electrical incident, the Technical Regulator require electrical workers to be assessed every 12 months.

This course also meets the requirement of the Work Health and Safety Regulations 2012, which require an electrical safety observer to have current (within 12 months) skills in rescue and resuscitation.

COURSE CONTENT

- Prepare to perform rescue procedures from live LV panel
- Carry out and complete rescue from live LV panel
- Respond to an emergency
- Perform CPR
- Communicate details of the incident
